Installation

To mark the Day of German Unity, Gunther Schumann has created an installation in the outdoor area of the Moritzburg State Art Museum. The sculpture depicts various social groups with different communication attitudes.

When viewed from different perspectives, it becomes clear that each figure is depicted twice - creating a variety of encounter situations. With this work, the artist comments on public political discourse, which is increasingly characterized by polemics and aggression.

Urban Art

Totem poles are monumental sculptures with a strong memorial character. In the indigenous population of North America in particular, they fulfilled various functions, such as depicting a family saga. However, their meaning is rarely apparent at first glance - only the respective family members can decipher the hidden messages. It is precisely this ambiguity that makes columns particularly exciting for me as an art object. But what could a totem for Halle-Neustadt look like?

In my design, I tried to pick up on various local cultural and social conflicts and translate them into a comic-like visual language. As the column is freestanding and has a relatively small diameter, my focus was on taking into account as many visual axes as possible and making it appealing even when passing by.

When is art private - and at what point does it become a public matter?


In homage to the Dadaist poet Kurt Schwitters, the artist Gunther Schumann, alias Square Boy, is creating an expansive temporary sculpture at Kunsthalle Ost. It will be made from cardboard, wood and other recycled materials.

According to Schwitters, the term Merz stands for a kind of overall world view. For this work, the focus is particularly on the fact that the Merzbau was a quiet, private work of art for Schwitters for a long time.

City-Loops

Urban Traveling Exhibition

City-Loops is a modular exhibition that can be adapted depending on the spatial situation.

The aim is to show art in unusual places in the urban environment and thus make it accessible to a wide range of people.

The paintings and sculptures in City-Loops deal thematically with human co-existence in a big city. They depict fictional scenes and action sequences that interlock like small pieces of a puzzle and stand for larger social and political contexts.






City Loop-Machine #1

The Pied Piper from Lünen

Room Installation

When a well-known AfD politician rolled through Thuringian schools on a Simson in 2024 to promote his political causes, I couldn't help but think of the German tale The Pied Piper of Hamelin. In this story, the children have to pay for their parents' failings by being seduced and kidnapped by the angry Pied Piper.

This analogy struck me as particularly apt given the AfD's current increased presence on social media such as TikTok - platforms used primarily by a young audience. The sad reality is that wherever far-right actors are granted influence in schools, the propensity for violence among children also increases. They often adopt the propagated dogmas without reflection.

My spatial installation completely surrounds the visitors, creating an immersive 360-degree experience that hopefully makes my political concerns clear.

Blu Hustle

Music and Visual Art

Blu Hustle's music oscillates stylistically between trip-hop, electro and electropop. Atmospheric soundscapes are created with the help of synthesizers and drum compositions. The name "Blu Hustle" is derived from: "Blue", which means blue, but also melancholic, and "to hustle", which in street slang means to work oneself to death.

Blu Hustle is primarily about experiences of alienation. In order to convey this, an audiovisual performance is to be realized in which video content and music content merge. As this is technically and materially very complex, I am currently looking for project partners with a focus on camera, dance and costume design.



Street-ComicUrban Animation Video

What happens when comics and street art merge in a playful way? Strange creatures suddenly appear in the tropical city - hallucinating monkeys, talking concrete pillars and other surreal figures. The result of the project is a sequential video that was subsequently set to music.

The individual sequences are created using a combination of paste-up (street art), puppet animation and stop-motion technology. The aesthetics are reminiscent of an animated slide show. Further street comic episodes are to follow in the future in order to further develop this technique and explore new narrative possibilities.







Tropical Heins

Art Collective

Robin Kowalewsky and I founded the artist collective Tropical Heins in 2013. Initially, we regularly applied to the urban art festival ibug, where we experimented with new ways of working on the wasteland. The festival enabled us to work with new materials and themes in a completely open-ended and process-oriented way. At the same time, we developed a common artistic approach and our own style.

As these project weeks were limited to ten days, a clear working framework was created that allowed us to engage in an intensive exchange. As you can imagine, artistic projects involve creative obstacles, conflicts and surprises that have to be overcome together. Each of us has to step back at one point or another in favor of the collective work.

Our reference project was also created during this time: an urban mini-golf course constructed and painted from various found objects.




However, the process-based and communicative way of working remains the core of Tropical Heins - and after every intensive week of work, a subsequent trip to the dump is unavoidable.

Originally planned as part of the Fantasia exhibition, Alexander Roschke and I realized an independent exhibition at Galerie Goethe 45.



The painting process was announced as an event so that guests could watch the transformation of the impossible city.



As a passionate cyclist, I have always had an ambivalent relationship with cars. Few things are as memorable as the feeling of being pushed to the side of the road by a Porsche SUV in a narrow street - and sending a silent prayer of thanks to your guardian angel.

In Germany in particular, the car is almost like an object of worship: it is carefully polished, lovingly cherished and proudly displayed. Even in the age of electromobility, it remains a status symbol - a sign of the energy transition and an expression of personal lifestyle. But to what extent does the choice of a vehicle actually serve a practical purpose, and where does pure object fetishism begin?

In my series This is not a Car, I take a humorous look at the relationship between vehicle and driver. After all, the choice of vehicle often reveals the character of its owner. The pictures were created as part of a VG-Bild-Kunst grant.

It all started when my former flatmate called me a "goldfish". At first I didn't know why, but he obviously saw a certain resemblance between me and this bubbling, shiny golden creature.

The more I thought about it, the more I realized how often we anthropomorphize animals - and, conversely, ascribe animal characteristics to humans. There are cat people and dog people, but also dirty pigs and spider monkeys, to name just a few examples.

This ongoing series of pictures takes a humorous look at the relationship between humans and animals. For me, the focus is on the characteristic attributes - not a naturalistic depiction.

Thanks to lateral anchors, they can be linked together and presented free-standing on pillars - or hung on the wall in the traditional way. A transparent varnish makes all the works weatherproof.
































The Traffic Jam
